Parent Local Governor Vacancy – Barton Hill Academy

Would you like to be more involved in your child's education? If you would, why not consider becoming a governor? We currently have one vacancy for a Parent Local Governor on the Barton Hill Academy Local Governing Body.

What do Parent Local Governors do?

Barton Hill Academy Local Governing Body is a committee of the Governing Board of Venturers Trust. The Local Governing Body, together with the Principal, is accountable to the Board for performance in all areas of the Academy, which includes ensuring children learn in a safe environment and to the maximum of their ability. Local Governors will support and, at the same time, challenge the Principal by gathering views, asking questions and helping to decide what is best for the Academy.

Any candidate must be the parent or carer of a registered pupil at the Academy at the date of the election and, if elected, throughout his or her term of office. Parent Local Governors serve for a period of four years, although may resign at any time by giving notice in writing.

If you would like to put your name forward, please complete the tear-off slip at the foot of this letter and return it to Gail Bragg (Chair of Barton Hill Academy Local Governing Body) at the school by noon on Friday 10 November 2017.

Barton Hill Academy Local Governing Body has the following members:

- A Chair and Deputy Chair approved by the Board
- Two Parent Local Governors elected by other parent/carers at the Academy
- One Staff Local Governor elected by their colleagues
- Co-opted Local Governors

Your Commitment

The responsibilities of the Parent Local Governor are to represent the interests and opinions of the Parent Body of the Academy to the LGB. If you become a Parent Local Governor you will also be taking on the following commitments to help make sure the academy is well managed;

- Share the responsibilities of the Local Governing Body as summarised above.
- Attend and participate in Local Governors' meetings regularly. The Local Governing Body generally meet five times a year at 4.00 pm. Meetings should last no more than 2 hours.
- Become involved and get to know the academy
- Undergo appropriate training.
- You may also be invited to sit on appointment panels or attend events at the Academy.
- You will be required to apply for a DBS enhanced disclosure.
- Respect confidentiality at all times.



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It is important to remember that all Local Governors, appointed or elected, serve in their own right and not as a delegate of the people who appointed or elected them.

If the number of nominations received are equal to or less than the number of vacancies there will be no need to hold a ballot and the candidate(s) will be duly elected.

- I have not, at any time, had passed on me a sentence of imprisonment for a minimum of five years.
- I have not, in the five years prior to applying to become a governor, been fined for causing a nuisance or disturbance on education premises.
- I am not subject to a disqualification order under the Criminal Justice and Court Services Act 2000.
- My estate has not been sequestrated.
- I am not the subject of a bankruptcy restrictions order or an interim order.
